Nominations cannot be accepted after this day.

All nominations shall be made in writing and shall be signed by at least twenty-five voters, or NOT less than 1% of the voters (whichever is the lesser) of the authority or ward (as the case may be), but in all cases by at least two voters. Each nomination shall also be accompanied by the candidate's declaration of qualification.

Nominations may be filed in person at the above location, on the date and hours specified, by an agent, or by fax. To obtain a nomination paper, and/or candidate's declaration of qualification, contact the S.E.O. at the telephone number listed below.

Nomination papers not accompanied by the required documents and not properly filed shall be rejected.

Notice of Voters List

Notice is hereby given that the **VOTERS LIST** may be revised by contacting the Senior Election Official to:

- a) Add the names of voters who are entitled to have their names on the list;
- b) Delete the names of persons who are not entitled to have their names on the list; and
- c) Make such other correction of errors to the list as required.

VOTER ELIGIBILITY:

A person is eligible to have his or her name added to the Voters List if he or she is:

- 1) a Canadian citizen and at least 18 years of age on election day; and
- 2) a resident of the local authority for at least six months prior to election day, OR a registered owner of land in the municipality for at least six months prior to election day.

NON-RESIDENT VOTERS QUALIFIED IN MORE THAN ONE WARD:

In accordance with Section 25(2) of The Municipal Council and School Boards Elections Act, any non-resident voter who owns property in more than one ward is responsible to notify the S.E.O. in writing, not later than September 18, 2018, of the ward in which they desire to vote. Failing the foregoing, the voter's name will be placed on the list as the S.E.O. may select. A maximum of two (2) non-resident property owners, per property, are permitted to vote in a municipal election.

APPLICATION FOR PERSONAL SECURITY PROTECTION:

A voter may apply in writing to the S.E.O. at the address/fax number below, no later than September 10, 2018 to have his/her name and other personal information omitted or obscured from the voters list in order to protect the voter's personal security. The application may be submitted in person, by mail or fax and must include your name, address and proof of identity.

All changes to the voters list must be completed on or before September 18, 2018.

BOARD OF REVISION FOR 2019 ASSESSMENTS

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that the 2019 assessment roll for the Rural Municipality of Elton has been deposited in the Municipal Office at Forrest, Manitoba, and is open for public inspection during regular business hours. Applications for revision may be made in accordance with sections 42 & 43 of the Assessment Act:

APPLICATION FOR REVISION

- 42(1) A person in whose name property has been assessed, a mortgagee in possession of property under section 114(1) of The Real Property Act, an occupier of premises who is required under the terms of a lease to pay the taxes on the property, or the assessor may make application for the revision of an assessment roll with respect to
- (a) liability to taxation;
 - (b) amount of assessed value;
 - (c) classification of property; or
 - (d) a refusal by an assessor to amend the assessment roll under subsection 13(2).

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- 43(1) An application for revision must
- (a) be made in writing;
 - (b) set out the roll number and legal description of the assessable property for which a revision is sought;
 - (c) state the grounds on which the application is based; and
 - (d) be filed by
 - (i) delivering it or causing it to be delivered to the office indicated in the public notice given under subsection 41(2); or
 - (ii) serving it upon the Secretary at least 15 days before the scheduled sitting date of the Board as indicated in the public notice.

The Board of Revision will sit on Tuesday, October 9, 2018 at 10:00 A.M. in the Council Chamber of the Rural Municipality of Elton to hear applications.

The final date on which applications must be received by the Secretary of the Board is Monday, September 24, 2018 at 4:30 P.M.

AUGUST 14, 2018 COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Councillors Mitchell, Campbell, Paterson, Bollman, Hales, and Reeve Farley attended. Financial statement for the month ending July 31, 2018 was accepted and filed. Subdivision File No. 4124-18-674 for NE ¼ 12-12-19 for Glen & Carol McLaughlin was approved with conditions. 3rd reading to BL 1597 (MWM Environmental Recycling Services) was given and passed. 2nd & 3rd readings to BL 1599 (Minto-Odanah Boundary Road Agmt) were given and passed. Agreement with RM of Oakview for billing of delinquent water accounts was adopted and BL 1600 for said agreement was given 1st reading. Agreement with the Municipality of North Cypress-Langford regarding Boundary Roads was adopted and BL 1601 for said agreement was given 1st reading. Conditional Use application No. C-04-18-E for Mona-Lynn Koroscil on SE ¼ 20-12-19 was approved. RFP for Douglas waterline repairs was not awarded as only 1 bid was received

and it was not in the best interest of Elton to proceed with the work. CAO and WERWC Manager Ralph Berg will ensure works get completed. Culvert replacements for NE-10-12-17 & SE 17-12-17 were awarded to Quarry Hills for the amount of \$2,900.00 each. Machinery shed roof repairs were awarded to Mark Vreeman for a cost of \$275.00 plus GST. Authorization was given for an additional contribution for water tanker lights to a maximum of \$1,000.00 subject to Cornwallis also contributing same amount. Authorization was given to Quarry Hills for an extension to complete works for Forrest drainage due to delays caused by the installation of new septic tanks by RRSD. Drainage request from Brad & Donna Mitchell for SE 33-11-147 and SW 4-12-17 was approved (Mitchell was excused due to conflict). Authorization were given to Kathleen Steele and Christy Burdeniuk to attend the MMAA district meeting on

September 21, 2018 in Brandon. Revised Policy No. 45-2016 (Utility Connection Process) was approved as presented. Council directed that the office be declared closed at Christmas every year for one (1) consecutive week, permitting office staff to have up to either three (3) days with no pay or chose to use vacation pay. Staff Overtime to July 31, 2018 was approved as circulated to Council. Donna Mitchell was authorized to attend the EMO Municipal Continuity Planning Training on September 6, 2018. Authorization was given to compensate Anita Goertzen (Elton EMO Coordinator) for training and coordinator duties at \$20.00 per hour upon submission of time logs. Accounts were approved in the amount of \$215,233.16. Meeting was adjourned to meet again on Tuesday, September 11, 2018 at 9:00 am or at the call of the Reeve.

HELP Tree Seedlings:

Mixed Large Willow

Pussy Willow

Cluster Shrub Willow

Prairie Sky Poplar

Okanese Poplar

NOTE: HELP will not market spruce or pine in the fall because they are the only varieties that have a very poor establishment rate when fall planted.

Tree Costs:

50 to 299 trees - \$2.50 each

300+ trees - \$1.50 each

Shipping Cost:

Shipping: 25¢ per seedling (minimum \$40 charge)
\$0 shipping charge if trees are picked up in Weyburn SK.
